It is a pleasure to write to you with an update on the progress at the school.

As you know I've been working at Carleton, along with other schools in the Trust, since May. Many thanks to those parent/carers who have made me feel welcome. I can honestly say that working with staff, parents, carers and in particular students at CHS has been a pleasure. Those who attended the Information Evening are aware that, whilst I felt there were many strengths at the school, there was significant work to be done to improve, in order to ensure that every young person is able to achieve their full potential. I'm pleased to say that the hard work of students and staff is really paying off and the school now feels very different - like a different place, and one that I am proud to show visitors around. Staff are under no illusions and know there is still a long way to go to become an outstanding school, but improvements are significant and great steps are being taken towards that goal.

My mantra is "Culture + Consistency = Excellence" which, in essence, means not putting a ceiling on what young people can achieve and ensuring there is a consistency of approach, delivering daily the very best lessons and provision that the young people deserve. At the heart of this is great teachers, support staff and leaders and making sure they have the very best framework, training and resources to be the very best they can be. I am pleased to say that there has been, and continues to be, weekly high quality training for staff which is constantly improving their practice. But whilst there has been investment in current staff there has also been a lots of recruitment going on. There have been significant changes to the Senior Leadership Team, not least of which is Mrs Cross taking up her post as permanent Head of School, which is fantastic news for the school (not that anyone thought for a second she wasn't already). I have also recruited high quality Directors of Maths and Science, and a Lead Practitioner in Science. Further investment will go into recruitment so that we ensure we have the very best professionals working with our young people.

It continues to be an exciting time for the school and, rest assured, everything is taking place so that outcomes for young people are improved swiftly.

I am also pleased to inform you that we have invested heavily in our new 'Learning Support' facility; a large computer suite will be installed over the half term break, which will be a great area for students to complete independent study and homework. With further improvements to student areas planned over the half term break I am sure our students will be pleased with the changes when they return from their break.

Our newly appointed Head Boy, Taylor Wood and Head Girl, Ellanna Duncan together with the Student Ambassadors have got off to a great start. Leading by example, they will inspire students to live the school's vision and values on a daily basis and will also support at school fundraisers and events such as open evenings, charity events and the school prom to name a few. Their first charity fundraiser was a great success and they raised over £300 for Macmillan Cancer Research. We are very proud of all the students appointed and wish them all the best in their new roles.

We have seen a wide range of visits and events this term and the extensive extra-curricular programme has already provided many memorable experiences. For example, our Year 7 rugby team achieved second place in the Wakefield Schools Cup. YEAR 11 ACHIEVEMENT UPDATE

Year 11 have really hit the ground running for their final year of secondary school, and have recognised that it is the most important year of their educational journey to date.

Students are attending 'Achieve' sessions to boost attainment and further support progress. We recommend that all Year 11 students should be completing between 2-3 hours school work per night, including homework and Achieve sessions. If you feel your child is struggling to complete this minimum expectation

please contact Mrs Norman who can provide support and guidance for their independent study. We can also support by making the Library available until 5.30 pm for students who would prefer to complete their independent study at school. It is vital that your child completes the recommended amount of independent study to achieve their target grades.

Year 11 will have a full mock exam schedule during next term. We will be supporting them with revision techniques and strategies for them to use during this exam period to enable the schedule to be as realistic as possible. We would encourage you to support your child at home by encouraging them to revise thoroughly for these exams and start in plenty of time.

LITERACY


At Carleton High School we realise the importance of reading as a building block for every child's education. We recognise that being a confident, enthusiastic and fluent reader is key to making progress at all levels in all subjects across the curriculum. The new GCSE requirements are even more challenging and students are expected to have a reading age that matches their chronological reading age. We want to prepare our students to get the very best qualifications possible. To equip our students with the necessary skills we have launched DEAR, or Drop Everything And Read. This happens at a different time every week - everyone, teachers and students, whatever lesson, settle back with a book for 30 minutes. You might have seen some evidence of this on our Twitter account - there's nothing more beautiful than seeing children and adults enjoying being engrossed in a good book! Tutor time has time for reading most days too.

Year 7 and 8 students are also part of the Accelerated Reader programme, and we are getting very close to our

first reading millionaires - a million words read. We know this core life skill is going to make such a difference to Carleton students, not just helping with learning and exam skills, but for enjoyment too. Our library is restocking regularly with the latest and greatest reads, but if you're thinking about early Christmas presents, a well-chosen book is never a bad choice.
