



As I write this final entry for the newsletter at the end of an academic year, it's difficult to comprehend that we've reached the end of a school year. There has been so much positive change in both secondary schools and I'm extremely proud of the work that staff and students have put in to achieve what we have. I'd also like to thank parents for their patience, when so much change is going on it's difficult for some to understand 'why?' until tangible results are achieved. The Ofsted report at Carleton, the examination results this summer, improved attendance and a huge drop in exclusions at both schools are validation of our work, and whilst we know that our work has only just started, there is so much to celebrate. I'm particularly proud of the amount of support we put in place for our Year 11 students this year, there have been countless residential, after school and weekend support sessions, and I'm not sure the staff could have done any more for them. I am equally proud of how the students have conducted themselves, we asked them to meet us half way, and they did, plus more.

When I first arrived last year, both secondary schools worked in isolation and there was very little collaborative work. Carleton needed to improve quickly and King's was in danger of underperforming. Both schools now work really closely together, and there are genuine opportunities for the schools to share good practice and support one another. King's has a new leadership team, a new found energy and drive, and there is a real purpose to the culture there. Carleton is completely transformed and unrecognisable from the school I arrived at last May, and the one described in the Ofsted inspection in 2017. The behaviour in both schools is a real strength. Teachers can really concentrate on delivering excellent lessons, and students are able to focus on their learning. I genuinely believe both schools are on a trajectory to be outstanding schools, and I'd be happy to send my three children to either school.

Our mantra of Culture + Consistency = Excellence continues to be at the heart of everything we do, which means we don't put a ceiling on what our students can achieve. We aim to be consistent in our approach to everything we do, so our standards are always high. We want our students to have as many opportunities open to them as possible when they leave us, regardless of starting point or background. Whilst examination results are incredibly important, they are only one part of a jigsaw. In September we launch a new curriculum which will ensure that we are widening our students' knowledge, deepening their cultural awareness, helping them become more rounded individuals and developing their communication skills. We are also investing in our support systems for students around mental health. On Monday and Tuesday, key members of staff were trained by Mental Health First Aid England, so they can be advocates and support our youngsters with all the pressures on young people in the modern world. It is an area of growing concern nationally, so we wanted to make sure our front line staff are well trained.

I hope you have a wonderful summer, and I'm very much looking to working with staff, students and parents in September.

Students were an absolute credit to the school and their families; their behaviour and conduct were exemplary at all times. During the inspection the students' pride in their school was evident; they were confident, articulate and eager to explain how the school has improved.

I would also like to take this opportunity to thank parents and carers for your overwhelming support through your parent survey responses, and to those of you who took the time to personally comment on the work of the school and the improvements that have been made over the course of the year.

In other news, a special congratulations to our new Head Boy, Liam Gee, Head Girl, Abi Rushton and their respective deputies James Bamford and Rosie Arnold, together with the rest of the new student ambassador team! We certainly put the range of potential candidates through their paces, having had to submit a letter of application, face an interview, and make a presentation to myself and Mrs Crewe. All students were very impressive.

A highlight for me was reading the student ambassador application letters, where students wrote such heart felt comments about the school, such as 'Recently I have become so proud of Carleton and so grateful that I got to see it as what it is now; it has become a place that both students and teachers can feel proud of!' We are very proud of all the students appointed to the team, and wish them all the best in their new roles.

We also said goodbye to Year 11 students this term after they completed their GCSE exams. We are extremely proud of the students for their commitment and dedication until the very end. Our students have benefitted from a wide range of extra intervention sessions, more than ever before, and I have every confidence that this will pay off for them in this year's summer results.

Another highlight for me this term has been our end of year Key Stage Reward evenings, where we got to celebrate the achievements of our incredible students with their families. A special mention to the winners of this year's epraise leaderboard. Nathan Spence achieved first place, followed by Kyle Wass in second place, and Luke Purcell in third place. All three boys were rewarded at our end of year Key Stage award ceremonies, along with other students who have shone with their effort and attainment in the different subject areas. We are incredibly proud of them all and their achievements over the year.

It was wonderful to be at the CRY (Cardiac Risk in the Young) heart screening event on 23 June, where 100 young people received a potentially life saving ECG. A big thank you to the Rory Embling Foundation and our student ambassadors who supported fundraising activities throughout this year, which made the event possible for the young people of Pontefract.

Finally, can I wish all staff, parents and students an enjoyable and restful summer break. We look forward to welcoming the new Year 7 intake as well as all the other students returning to the school on Wednesday, 4 September for another successful school year.

UNIFORM

Just a polite reminder that we wrote to all parents/carers in May to inform you of our school uniform expectations which are applicable from September 2019. The details of this letter and the uniform guide can be found on the school website. I would specifically like to remind you of some key uniform changes:

- All students will be required to have all new logoed items after the one year grace period that we provided last year. This also includes logoed skirts.
- All students will be required to have the new style Carleton High School tie. This will be plain navy with the school logo at the bottom and will be given to students in the final week of the summer term.
- All students will be required to have a white shirt.
- If students wear an optional sweater, this should be a V-neck navy knitted jumper after the one year grace period we provided last year.

If you would like to check that the uniform items purchased for your child meet our expectations, I will be holding 'Uniform Checking Sessions' on Thursday, 18 July 4.00pm-5.00pm and Wednesday, 21 August 9.00am-11.00am. Finally, following parental feedback, the Trust has moved to local uniform suppliers. Our official uniform suppliers are Better and Bright and Signature Retail.


