## Geography Achieve in the Field.

The best way to fully learn and understand geography concepts and processes is to get out of the classroom and see them "in real life". Therefore, we are delighted to be able to offer all year 11 geographers an opportunity to spend one of their Achieve Sessions out in the field, in this instance in Leeds.

Leeds is a main case study examined in paper 2 and by spending a couple of hours in the city visiting different areas we are also able to revise topics such as urban regeneration, sustainable living, deindustrialisation and factory closure, the impact of globalisation, inequalities across a city and conflict on the rural urban fringe. As well as this we will cover a range of fieldwork skills which are tested in paper 3.

On **Wednesday 1 May**, we will leave school at 2.20pm and head to Leeds Dock where we will look at regeneration and the Climate Innovation District which is an example of sustainable planning. From here we will travel out along the A64, stopping in Harehills, Cross Gates and Barwick in Elmet before returning back to school at approximately 6.15pm.

There is no cost to the trip. Just motivation to make the most of this revision opportunity is needed. Students will be given time to change as they are not required to wear school uniform on the trip.
